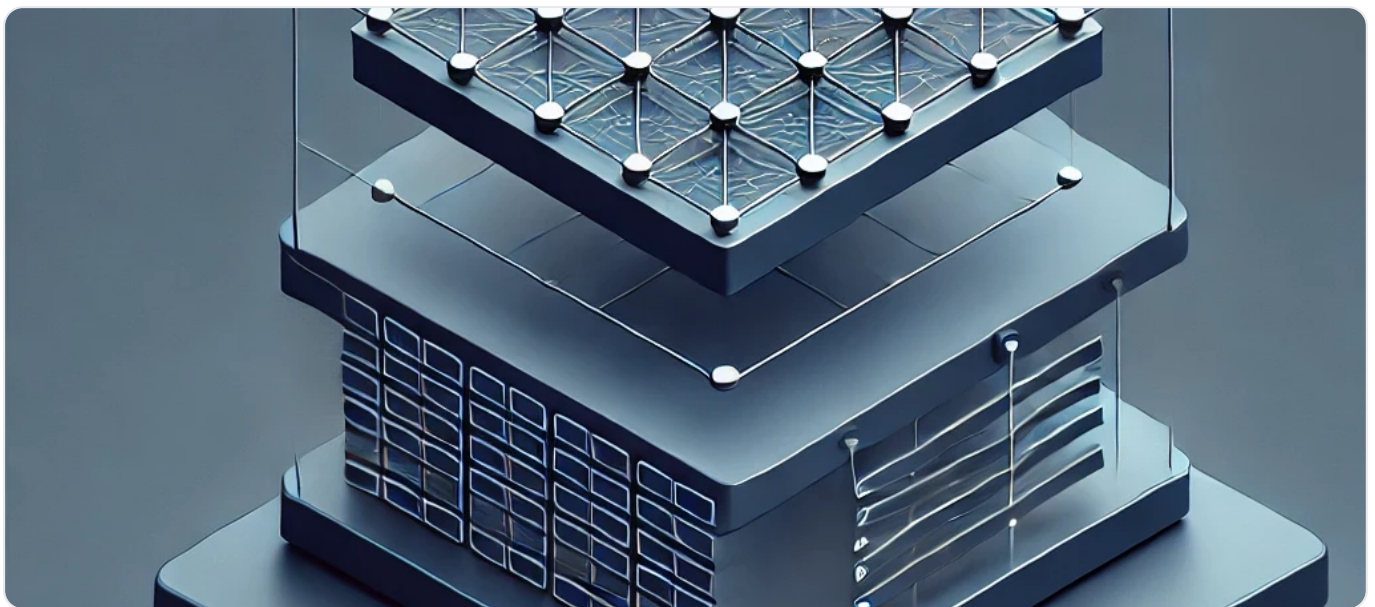

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## Frequently asked questions

### What is matrixed navigation?

The ability to view the same initiative through more than one hierarchy, by function, workstream, region, business unit, or strategic priority, without duplicating data or losing context. Transformation programs are matrixed by nature; a single initiative belongs to several dimensions at once, and traditional tools force it into one.

### What goes wrong when a transformation program is forced into a single hierarchy?

Fragmented visibility for executives, teams in different functions struggling to align, benefits being double-counted or missed where initiatives overlap, and reports manually re-cut every time the audience changes from a cross-functional meeting to a departmental one. The cumulative effect is governance routines that don't work and slower decisions.

### How do transformation programs avoid double-counting benefits?

Because overlapping initiatives get counted in every hierarchy they appear in, or fall between them. Tag summary pages in Conductor let each initiative be reported across multiple dimensions from one record, so the number a function sees and the number the program sees are the same number.

### How does matrixed navigation connect strategy to execution?

Through top-down KPI alignment: strategic goals are set at the program level and linked to the initiatives that deliver them, so every project contributes to a measurable outcome and leaders can navigate from a strategic priority down to the work behind it and back.

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
